


Raleigh, NC, Area Economic Summary

Unemployment rates for the Raleigh, NC, Area, selected area counties, and the nation



Average weekly wages for all industries by county


Raleigh area, first quarter 2019

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector





Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories


12-month percent change in CPI-U, September

Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide


12-month percent changes in PPI


